education, and capacity building to underprivileged communities.

Designed to promote financial inclusion and economic independence, especially for rural women and youth, SMJ offers courses in tailoring, beauty culture, computer literacy, and more—each tailored to the specific needs of local communities.

Empowering Women and Rural

From self-help groups to livelihood

programs, the Foundation has empowered

women and rural communities to become

self-reliant and economically active. Through partnerships and on-ground initiatives, thousands of women have been equipped with tools to lead change within their families and communities. One of the trainees in Rudrapur, which is also an aspirational district of India, started her own business after receiving training from Samarth-Jyoti. With the support of our SHG (Self-Help Group) formation, and guidance from our team, she was able to diversify her work, which not only enhanced her family income but also instilled confidence in her to support others in her community. A similar inspiring story comes from Puja in Pune. She was so happy to show us the

clothes she stitched for herself and her children. Starting her small business from home, she is now fulfilling her dreams and proudly contributing to her household. These are just a few of the many case studies that reflect the positive change being observed across India through our intervention. I see this as a powerful opportunity for many other women who may have lost hope due to challenging family circumstances

Education for the Underserved

divide and empower children with the tools to lead better, more informed lives. **Grassroots-Led, Data-Driven Impact**Dr. Suman Minda ensures that all SNMF projects are based on **community need assessments**. Her leadership style is handson and participative—she **personally**

Beyond the grid, Tata Power is igniting change through transformative community initiatives that uplift, educate, and inspire, proving that true power lies in meaningful impact.

Tata Power's commitment to nation-building goes far beyond watts and volts. Through its flagship CSR brand SAATHI, Tata Power is creating real change in India's most underserved communities. From clean energy to clean water, from education to inclusion, the impact is deeprooted and far-reaching.

From setting up digital classrooms in Rajasthan and Tamil Nadu to rolling out Health and Sanitation Corners in schools, the company is shaping young minds with better awareness on WASH and menstrual hygiene.

Empowering women is another cornerstone of Tata Power's CSR. Initiatives like Anokha Dhaaga and Abha have supported over 25,000 women's self-help groups. Roshni Vocational Centres have trained over 39,000 youth. The Tata Power Skill Development Institute is preparing thousands for green jobs in the renewable energy sector.

Health, inclusion, and dignity are at the heart of Tata Power's work. PayAutention, a unique autism support platform, is training Anganwadi workers and SHGs to support children with neurodiverse needs. Mobile Medical Units are taking healthcare to remote villages, while RO water systems are giving students safe drinking water.

Tata Power is sparking a green movement through initiatives like Club Enerji and Tree Mittra. With more than 6 lakh trees planted, these efforts show how small steps can grow into big environmental change. The 50-year-old Mahseer Conservation Programme also reflects Tata Power's long-term commitment to protecting nature and wildlife.

In FY23 alone, Tata Power invested 4.06 crore in CSR. With bold goals to train 35 lakh youth and support 1 lakh SHGs by 2027, Tata Power is showing that sustainability isn't just a plan — it's a promise.

THE ROAD TO SCHOOL:

EMPOWERING FUTURE THROUGH EDUCATION

n India's underserved regions, education is the most powerful lever to break the cycle of intergenerational poverty. Ashok Leyland's flagship CSR initiative - The Road to School (RTS) ecosystem - comprising the Road to School, Road to Livelihood (RTL), and RTS - Social Development programs - embodies this belief through holistic, inclusive, and sustainable model that nurtures both children and their communities.

At its core, the RTS program supports children in grades 1 to 8 from rural and remote government schools. RTS focuses on bridging learning gaps through foundational literacy and numeracy and achievement of minimum grade-based learning levels, while nurturing children's creativity, health, and emotional well-being. The program integrates art education, sports, wellness sessions, and community engagement, creating a nurturing environment that fosters all-round development.



As students progress, the Road to Livelihood (RTL) program addresses the needs of those in grades 9 to 12. Through career guidance, digital literacy, spoken English, and adolescent wellness sessions, RTL prepares students to navigate life after school with confidence. It empowers them with essential life skills and guidance towards sustainable livelihoods.

Yet, education does not exist in isolation. The RTS-Social Development program recognizes that a child's success is deeply intertwined with the well-being of their family and community. It raises awareness about education, hygiene, among others, and connects families - particularly women - to government welfare schemes and livelihood training. This strengthens




the social foundation that supports a child's learning journey, making education a sustainable priority.

Together, these three integrated programs form a powerful model that not only uplifts students but transforms communities.

Since 2015, the RTS ecosystem has impacted close to 2600+ schools and more than 4,80,000 students with 25 to 30% improvement in learning. But its true success lies in the lives it has touched—the children who now dream bigger, the families who believe in education, and the communities that are rising together.

The RTS ecosystem is more than a program. It is a movement—one that champions equity, dignity, and opportunity for every child, no matter where they begin









ech Mahindra, a leading global technology and consulting powerhouse, is making a difference beyond business. Blending innovation with compassion, the company uses technology to drive inclusive growth and social transformation.

Guided by the Mahindra Group's philosophy of "Rise," Tech Mahindra's CSR efforts focus on education, employability, and empowerment, especially for women and persons with disabilities, creating a lasting impact in communities across India.

With a clear vision of Empowerment through Education, the Tech Mahindra Foundation (TMF) spearheads initiatives in education, employability, and disability inclusion, generating meaningful, long-term opportunities for underprivileged communities.

TMF runs the SMART (Skills for Market Training) program through 86 centres across 11 cities, providing skill development across various sectors to prepare youth from underserved communities for the job market. The program

also includes 12 SMART Academies specializing in Healthcare, Digital Technologies, and Logistics and Supply Chain Management. Together, these centres have trained over 100,000 young people, achieving a placement rate exceeding 75%.

TMF also promotes holistic development through programs like ARISE (All Round Improvement in School Education), which works with 15 government schools, and Shikshaantar, a comprehensive teacher training initiative.

Disability inclusion is a key priority for TMF, which works to ensure equal access to education and employment for persons with disabilities. Additionally, the Foundation promotes corporate volunteering to cultivate a strong culture of social responsibility within Tech Mahindra.

Through strategic, community-centric CSR programs, Tech Mahindra Foundation is transforming individual lives while contributing to national priorities in skill development, inclusive education, and sustainable growth, demonstrating how business can be a powerful force for good.

empowering communities through purpose-driven csr



t Greenlam Industries, the belief "business grows best when people and the planet grow with it" lies at the heart of its corporate social responsibility (CSR) efforts. As a global leader in surfacing and substrate solutions, Greenlam views its role not just as a manufacturer, but as a long-term development partner in the communities where it operates. Over the past three years, the company has steadily built a CSR portfolio that combines strategic focus with grassroots execution—delivering long-lasting change in education, healthcare, and water sustainability.

Geographic Reach Rooted in Responsibility The CSR footprint extends across four key Greenlam plant-adjacent locations:

Behror (Rajasthan), Nalagarh (Himachal Pradesh), Tindivanam (Tamil Nadu) and Prantij (Gujarat).

Each of these locations was chosen based on the local development needs and Greenlam's long-term operational presence in the area, ensuring both relevance and continuity of impact.

Transforming Government Schools into Holistic Learning Spaces One of

Greenlam's flagship efforts has been the Whole School Transformation initiative, developed in collaboration with the Learning Links Foundation. Across three years, the program has focused on improving foundational literacy and numeracy, enhancing digital learning, strengthening teaching capacity, and building inclusive school environments. More than 720 classroom sessions have been conducted on literacy, numeracy, STEM, and life skills. A cohort of 35+ teachers has been trained in activity-based pedagogy and digital methods. Physical upgrades were made to seven schools, including refurbished classrooms, educational wall art, and the provision of digital kits. To deepen community participation, over 250 parents were engaged through School Management Committees and school events. A total of 81 wellness sessions were also delivered, promoting students' socialemotional learning and hygiene awareness.

Impact: Students demonstrated on an average 12% improvement in learning outcomes in math and language, while teacher effectiveness and parent-school collaboration showed significant improvement.

Making Preventive Healthcare Accessible and Inclusive Greenlam's healthcare interventions, implemented in partnership with MAMTA Health Institute for Mother and Child and Sambhav Foundation, have targeted some of the most pressing health issues in rural India—especially those affecting women, adolescents, and frontline workers.

Across three years, the company conducted over 900 community health sessions, reaching more than 15,000 individuals with information and support on menstrual hygiene, nutrition, adolescent health, and non-communicable diseases. More than 600 people were screened through multi-disease health camps, and 77 ASHA and ANM workers (Accredited

Social Health Activist and Auxiliary Nurse Midwife) were trained in using digital health portals and reporting systems.

Greenlam also addressed local health infrastructure gaps through solarizing PHCs (Primary Health Centres) in Behror, Rajasthan to ensure uninterrupted power supply, and deployed a patient transport vehicle in Tindivanam, Tamil Nadu to improve emergency health access. To facilitate access to public health benefits, Greenlam enabled access to 3,000 ABHA cards and 2,000 Ayushman Bharat cards for community members.

Impact: Greenlam's efforts have increased healthcare awareness and facilitated behavior change, improved last-mile access to healthcare services, and strengthened public health systems in partnership with local governments.

Building Water Security and Climate Resilience In response to India's growing water stress, Greenlam has invested in restoring traditional water bodies, building irrigation infrastructure, and supporting sustainable agricultural practices. These efforts were led in collaboration with the Sir Syed Trust, Sehgal Foundation and PHD Rural Development

Over ten community ponds have been rejuvenated across Rajasthan and Himachal Pradesh, now benefiting 3,500+ people with improved water access. In Jaipur's Aandhi village, a check dam constructed by Greenlam now conserves 12 million litres of rainwater annually. All water structures were equipped with safety and beautification features such as solar lights, railings, benches and shaded huts to promote inclusive social spaces for the community.

In parallel, Greenlam supported sustainable farming practices across 1,345 hectares of land using vermicompost, water budgeting, and micro-irrigation systems. Drinking water was made safer and more accessible through the installation of an RO plant managed by the local community in Nalagarh, Himachal Pradesh thus ensuring sustainability of interventions.

Impact: These interventions have collectively enabled over 65 million litres of annual groundwater recharge, improved irrigation, and promoted climate resilience through community-led water governance.

A Culture of Long-Term Commitment What sets Greenlam's CSR journey apart is not just the scale of interventions but the depth of community engagement. Whether it's transforming government schools into vibrant learning spaces or building digital capacity among frontline healthcare workers, every program is designed to outlast its funding cycle—building local ownership, strengthening public systems, and promoting self-reliance.

By embedding social impact into its core ethos, Greenlam Industries continues to prove that purposeful business is not just about doing well—it's about doing good, sustainably and equitably.



INDIA'S SILENT ARCHITECTS:

HOW ICICI IS REBUILDING LIVES BRICK BY BRICK

he pathbreakers of modern finance, relentlessly pushing boundaries, foreseeing the future, and constantly forging new paths—ICICI Bank has long been the trailblazer in India's banking landscape.

Established in 1955 as the Industrial Credit and Investment Corporation of India, it transformed into a full-fledged bank in 1994, marking the beginning of a new era in Indian banking.

ICICI introduced India's first internet banking and mobile app services and was among the world's first to offer voice-based payments. Yet, its vision has never been confined to banking and business alone.

ICICI has emerged as a compassionate force, transforming lives through its far-reaching Corporate Social

Responsibility (CSR) initiatives. Channelled through the ICICI Foundation for Inclusive Growth, the Bank's programs are grounded in grassroots realities, bringing hope and sustainable change to millions.

Focusing on healthcare, environmental protection, skill development, and rural empower ment, the Bank has made a significant impact. It has facilitated the installation of 500

dialysis machines, provided blood transport vehicles across the country, and supported cancer care for underprivileged patients in need of critical treatment. At the core of ICICI's efforts is a deep-rooted belief in empowerment as a catalyst for change. Through its unwavering support, over 5 million rural women have transformed into entrepreneurs.

Parallelly, the Bank's flagship initiative, the ICICI Academy for Skills, has equipped over 200,000 youth with practical training and confidence, enabling them to build sustainable livelihoods.

ICICI Bank's environmental interventions are just as transformative. In its mission to restore ecological balance, 600 villages have been declared 'zero burning zones,' 2,245 acres of grassland have been developed, and more than 5,800 rural schools now harvest rainwater.

From providing emergency aid to 14,000 families during natural calamities to ensuring water security and bringing renewable energy to underserved regions, ICICI Bank is laying the foundation for long-term, inclusive development.







Making Healthcare Accessible - The Community Health Project

The lack of doctors and critical health services in rural areas is real, and well known. In the region that Nayara Energy operates in, patients are required to travel a distance of 40 & 20 kms either way to access even the basic health services. Public health issues like anemia, malnutrition, poor hygiene practices & high consumption of tobacco products continue to plague the region, adding to the sense of drudgery. The Community Health Project addresses the above issues, providing basic healthcare services in surrounding villages since 2006. The umbrella program is tailor made to meet the needs of the surrounding communities, and is inclusive of-



- Mobile Health Van –Visits 17 villages as per pre-designed and pre-communicated schedule.
- Community Health Center, Jhakhar Provides outpatient services to 5 surrounding villages. OPD facility is available in the center 6 days a week, along with basic laboratory facilities.
- OPD services –Reaches out to more than 6000 patients across 3 villages.
- Home visits for bedridden patients Catering to the bedridden patients, the project facilitates in house health services to the needy.
- Specialized camps Need-based and targeted camps such as Eye screening, Dental Camps, General Health Check-ups etc. provide additional and specialized services other than regular OPD ones.
- Behaviour Change and Communication –IEC and awareness generation programs related to general health, substance abuse, first aid, NCDs, etc. target long term behaviour change in communities, reinforcing the criticality of preventive health.

PRERNA FOUNDATION'S JOURNEY OF COMPASSION AND PASSION

A Flood of Compassion in Nari Village

In June 2025, torrential rains turned the lowlands near Nari village, Bhavnagar, into a perilous archipelago of mud and water. As **floodwaters swallowed pastures and homes**, hundreds of cattle were left marooned on shrinking islands of high ground. It was a desperate scene – frightened animals bellowing into the storm, villagers watching helplessly from afar. At dawn, Prerna Foundation's team from the Agiyali animal hospital arrived like an answered prayer. Braving currents and driving rain, **over 60 volunteers fanned out with ropes and rafts**, partnering with local welfare groups to reach each stranded cow and buffalo. In a massive community effort, more than **400 cattle were guided to safety on higher ground**.



Healing Lives, Big and Small

Prerna Foundation's 24/7 "Karuna Abhiyan" (compassion campaign) embodies their core ethosresponding swiftly to animals in distress, day or night. From farm fields to wild forests, their efforts span across locations like Agiyali and the Jivdaya hospital in Ganeshgadh. Prerna Foundation's CSR initiatives include rescuing injured and endangered animals and birds (including protected Schedule I and II species), restoring biodiversity through lush Miyawaki forests, promoting environmental education and awareness, and empowering a grassroots network of dedicated "Jivdaya Rakshak" volunteers, all driven by an unwavering compassion to safeguard our planet's most vulnerable creatures and fragile habitats.

One striking example: under a moonlit sky near Dwarka, volunteers **rescued 30 wild boars** from an open well overnight, returning each to freedom. Since its inception in 2023, the Foundation has saved thousands— **from injured peacocks to abandoned calves**—most rehabilitated and released. Recognized by Gujarat's government as an official wildlife treatment center. In every bandaged wing and splinted leg, one sees that blend of love and science restoring hope.

FROM BARREN LAND TO BIODIVERSITY PARK

Rescue is only the beginning; healing culminates in freedom. For Prerna Foundation's animals, that freedom often leads to a remarkable sanctuary: a young forest in Dwarka, grown on once-barren hospital land. In 2021, the Foundation's environmental wing, CleanEarth, revitalized the soil using their organic products—Nisarg Shakti and Nisarg Poshan—and planted thousands of native saplings using the Miyawaki technique. The result: a dense, thriving forest growing 10 times faster and 30 times denser than usual. Now a rich biodiversity park, it provides a natural home for many rescued animals—peacocks, owls, cranes, nilgai, and more—restoring food chains and rewilding the landscape. This living forest stands as a "circle of conservation" proving that both land and life can heal.

Seeds of a Sustainable Future

Renewables and CleanEarth—the Group advances sustainability on multiple fronts. While BA Prerna powers communities with wind and solar energy, CleanEarth transforms waste into resources: refuse-derived fuel (RDF) replacing coal in industries, and compost restoring soil health. The Dwarka forest is an example of this synergy, created using recycled organic matter and clean energy principles. By 2025, BA Prerna had planted over 35,000 trees, processed 500+ tons of organic waste, and used 5,000+ tons of RDF—avoiding an estimated 6,700 tons of CO₂-equivalent emissions. Every tree, every rescued animal, every repurposed ton of waste reflects their belief that environmental care and animal welfare are deeply interconnected—two halves of the same heartbeat driving sustainable progress.







With the planet at a crossroads of environmental strain and social unrest, The Art of Living, guided by the profound vision of global humanitarian and spiritual leader Gurudev Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, is nurturing a renaissance of human and ecological well-being. What began as a spiritual movement has blossomed into one of the world's most far-reaching initiatives—reviving nature, empowering communities, and rekindling self-reliance across villages, towns, and continents.

At the heart of this transformation lies an integrated approach that connects water, soil, people, and purpose.

With more than 70 rivers and streams rejuvenated, and over 1,05,000 recharge structures constructed, The Art of Living's water conservation movement is restoring the natural flow of water across once-parched landscapes. Over 17,402 crore litres of water have been conserved—reviving barren farmlands, recharging aquifers, and restoring livelihoods across drought-hit regions.

In the agricultural sector, more than 23 lakh farmers have been trained in natural, sustainable techniques—reviving indigenous wisdom while enhancing productivity. In suicide-prone districts, 1.15 lakh farmers now cultivate with confidence, using climate-resilient techniques across more than 56,000 acres. For these farmers, agriculture is not just about harvests—it's about healing the land, restoring self-worth, and building lasting security.

This environmental revival extends skyward. Over 100 million trees have been planted across 36 countries, making it one of the world's most extensive grassroots afforestation efforts. From the 70,000+ saplings

planted in Ladakh's freezing altitudes to dense green corridors along river basins, and oil-seed trees like Mahua and Karanj flourishing in Maharashtra, forests are returning—and with them, biodiversity, balance, and the breath of life. Equally powerful is the transformation in human lives. Women, in particular, are leading change at every level. In Tamil Nadu, 44,000 women came together to revive the Naganadhi River. Across India, over 1.11 lakh women have received livelihood training, and 1.15 lakh girls have been educated on menstrual hygiene. These are not isolated efforts—they are waves of empowerment reshaping entire communities.

Education remains a cornerstone of this holistic vision. Through 1,327+ free schools in 22 states, The Art of Living is bringing quality education to over 1 lakh children, most of whom are first-generation learners from tribal, rural, or slum areas. In some villages, the journey to school spans 30 km on unpaved roads—but it leads to futures once thought unreachable.

To ensure employability and economic self-reliance, more than 4.2 lakh youth have been trained through 120+ skill development centres in 23 states. These trainings span 48 job roles in 12 sectors—from tailoring to solar energy, from computer literacy to rural entrepreneurship. The result is a generation that is not just skilled, but inspired.

In India's remote and sensitive border regions more than 4.7 lakh citizens have been impacted, with 1.95 lakh people benefiting from clean, renewable energy. These initiatives have illuminated more than 660 villages—dispersing darkness not just from homes, but from hearts and hopes.

The Art of Living's prison programmes have brought emotional and mental transformation to over 8,00,000 inmates across 65 countries through yoga, meditation, and Sudarshan Kriya. Since 2019, we have empowered more than 8500+ prisoners across India with vocational skills, certification, and job support—enabling a fresh start after release.

Every initiative is rooted in a deeply interconnected ecosystem—where each action amplifies the next. Rejuvenated rivers nourish farmlands. Thriving farms support families. Educated children return as leaders. Empowered women heal ecosystems. Renewable energy sustains clean living. And each piece strengthens the whole.

In an age where development often sidelines nature and the marginalised, The Art of Living offers a new paradigm—where the environment and humanity rise together.

MHUs provide vital care such as cataract surgeries under the "Restoration of Vision" program and offer cancer and palliative care, reducing barriers to healthcare access for elders.

champions of their students' potential.
TFI's impact extends well beyond school walls. Through collaborations with organizations like Karunya Trust and Smile Foundation, TFI is helping level the playing field for marginalized children, offering access to formal education, healthcare, and nutrition. Over 525 girls have been empowered to pursue engineering degrees through dedicated scholarships, actively challenging gender inequality.

Nutrition remains a cornerstone of TFI's work. Since 2014, in partnership with The Akshaya Patra Foundation, TFI has served over 70 million nutritious meals to more than 300,000 children, ensuring hunger doesn't stand in the way of learning.

Meanwhile, through the Rubicon Foundation, TFI supports youth from Tier 2 and 3 colleges with career counseling, training, and job placements—paving the way for future success.

Healthcare is another critical pillar. In collaboration with Tata Memorial Hospital and CanKids, TFI supports children battling cancer with timely treatment, emotional care, and education, alleviating the burden for families navigating both illness and poverty.
